

consider connecting to the water main by the gate so that the tank is automatically filled. They also request that they be allowed to fence off the individual allotments due to a problem with both pigeon and deer eating the plants.

The allotment holders have also offered to keep the paths and surrounding area clear.

Members expressed concern over how much money should be spent on the site as it was only a ten-year lease and it had been agreed and the allotment holders had been informed that the water tank would only be filled on an ad hoc basis. Fencing off of the individual allotments could be done by putting up fruit netting and fencing could be looked at in next years budget to prevent the deer from entering the field.

It was agreed that the water connection to the mains would not be possible and potentially cause too many problems.

6d Letter of complaint relating to parking on the Wick Farm Estate.

Some Members reported that parking was a problem at weekends and during school hours and agreed that the police be asked to monitor the situation.

Councillor Crabtree reported that Norfolk County Council were looking at the access to the school, which could improve the situation.

Members were concerned that work had not started on Merton Road to alleviate the congestion problems.

7 **LOCH NEATON MEETING REPORT**

Councillor Harvey reported that he had attended a meeting with the resident's and the Loch Neaton Management Committee. Concern was expressed that there was no written agreement between the Council and the Loch Neaton Management Committee as to the responsibilities and liabilities of each party. Their other concern was the loss of revenue from fishing and the rising costs of insurance.

Members discussed the issues and agreed that Councillors Harvey, Wykes and Osborn should form a sub-committee to look at putting together an agreement incorporating the help of the tree officer from Breckland and the Forestry Commission to give advice on tree maintenance on the embankment and report back to the Committee.

One Member suggested that the Loch Neaton Management Committee apply to the Council for a grant.

8 **GREEN OPEN SPACE SITES**

A map had been received by the office showing all the green open spaces, which Breckland owned, within the town.

Members felt that they should be looking at land for a skateboard park and felt that the map did not indicate any pieces large enough and agreed to defer any decision to a more suitable time.

9 **MEMORIAL GARDEN PERGOLA**

The safety of pergola was discussed.

It was proposed by Councillor Rudling and seconded by Councillor Ivory and

RESOLVED

That quotations be sought to remove the pergola and replace the legs.

10 **CEMETERY MAINTENANCE**

It was agreed that a meeting be arranged for Thursday 9 July at 9am.

11 **WATER FEATURE REPORT**

Councillor Ivory reported that the work on the rock had been started on, the equipment needed had been arranged, the safety barriers were ready and 90% of the work would be completed by the end of the following week.

The Chairman thanked Councillor Ivory on behalf of the Council for all the work he had done.

12 **MEMORIAL GARDEN DAMAGED WALL**

It was proposed by Councillor Rudling, seconded by Councillor Anderson
